### Explanatory Notes

**Grade** = your result for the qualification or a particular unit

**Raw Mark** = your score for an exam paper or assessment (or a total of these scores), including any special consideration

**Uniform Mark/Points** = your raw mark converted to a uniform mark or points score

### GCSE (9-1)

The overall results of GCSE (9-1), including those for short courses, are reported on a nine-point grade scale: 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1, of which 9 is the highest and 1 the lowest.

Candidates who do not reach the minimum standard for grade 1 are shown as Unclassified. Only grades 9 to 1 will be recorded on certificates.

The results of GCSE (9-1) (Double Award) Combined Science will be awarded as if it is one qualification on a 17-point grade scale: 9-9, 9-8, 8-8, 8-7, 7-7, 7-6, 6-6, 6-5, 5-5, 5-4, 4-4, 4-3, 3-3, 3-2, 2-2, 2-1, 1-1, of which 9-9 is the highest and 1-1 the lowest. Candidates who do not reach the minimum standard for grade 1-1 are shown as Unclassified. Only grades 9-9 to 1-1 will be recorded on certificates.

The results of GCSE (9-1) English Spoken Language are reported on a three-point scale: Distinction (D), Merit (M) and Pass (P), of which Distinction (D) is the highest and Pass (P) the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required to achieve a Pass receive a Not Classified (NC) grade, which will be recorded on the certificate.
