- 2 say what your area is like (e.g. location / description / amenities);
- 3 mention a particular activity you have done in your area recently or you will do in your area, and say how you feel about it;
- 4 say what your favourite place in your area is, what you like to do there and why (e.g. leisure centre / shopping area / sports club);
- 5 say what your ideal neighbourhood or area would be like and why.

**Remember:**

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- 1 say who you are and what food and drink you like to have;
- 2 say what you do to keep fit (e.g. where / when / how often);
- 3 describe what you have done recently or what you will do to have a healthier lifestyle, and say how you feel about it;
- 4 say why it is important to have a healthy lifestyle;
- 5 say what you would do to help your school promote healthy eating and exercise, and why.

- 3 describe an evening activity you have taken part in recently or that you will take part in, and say how you feel about it;
- 4 say what you like about weekends and why;
- 5 say what your ideal weekend would be and why.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- 1 say who you are and where your Turkish exchange family lives;
- 2 give details of your exchange family (e.g. people/age/descriptions);
- 3 describe something you did or that you plan to do while staying with the family, and say how you feel about it;
- 4 say what is good about exchange visits and why;
- 5 say what you would do if a Turkish student came to stay with you and why.
