The Cambridge Progression suite — HOW CAN IT BENEFIT YOUR CENTRE?

Our Cambridge Progression English and maths qualifications are part of a carefully integrated package of qualifications and support materials that make sure learners are secure in their underpinning English and maths skills on their journey towards a Level 2 qualification in Functional Skills or GCSEs.

HOW CAN YOU MEET THE FUNDING CONDITION?

For 16 to 19-year-olds, Cambridge Progression Awards and Certificates are approved on Section 96 and can be used in study programmes. However, in their own right, they don't meet the funding condition. To meet this, learners must be registered on a programme containing GCSE or Functional Skills English and Maths.

Cambridge Progression — funded by the SFA and the EFA.

High quality assessment tools are standard

Centres are using our Functional Skills Diagnostic
Assessment to assess underpinning and process skills. In
the marking grid, if a learner shows a gap in a particular
skill, our Diagnostic Assessment directs them to the
appropriate Cambridge Progression Award. They're then
placed on the appropriate Cambridge Progression Award(s)
in the first academic term so they secure the underpinning
skills needed for their Functional Skills qualification, done
in the second term.

OFFERING YOU MORE

Our Diagnostic Assessment assesses the skills within the Adult Curricula Literacy and Numeracy, including skills left out by other IT-based Diagnostic Tools such as specific spelling, speaking and listening, and maths skills that can't be assessed by IT.

HOW CAN YOU USE CAMBRIDGE PROGRESSION WITH GCSEs?

You can use Cambridge Progression units to support learners who haven't received a GCSE A-C grade – we've certainly seen centres doing this. You can deliver these units within the GCSE Learning Programme and equip learners with the specific English or maths skills they've been missing.

The learners will also be certificated with a motivational Award in Cambridge Progression in their GCSE programme.

WHY CHOOSE THIS MODEL?

This is a good practice to break that cycle of retakes and the negative feeling these learners doing a retake programme can hold towards GCSEs. It gives the learners quick wins and the underpinning skills they've been missing to support them achieving a GCSE in English or Maths.

We can receive work by post and electronically by email or as an e-portfolio and you can change how you submit work to us with each cohort and for individual learners within a cohort. Our e-portfolio means learners can collect evidence towards their units while providing tutors with the evidence of the time taken to develop the portfolio.


Many of our vocational qualifications are already mapped to our English and maths qualifications and we're working towards this applying to all of them.


TAKE A LOOK INTO TEEG

Schools, colleges, universities and other organisations who sign up for TEEG will be able to tap into relevant services and benefits including training for teachers, seminars, relevant qualifications, a directory of approachable employers, business mentors and specialist careers guidance, as well as participation in the National Enterprise Challenge and YES' 12 Steps to Success programme. There is a membership fee that includes some services but many are on a 'pay as you go' basis, so members only pay for what they want.

What's new on Cambridge Nationals?

If you offer Cambridge Nationals, you'll be able to use some exciting new resources soon. They're designed to help you embed English and maths into the delivery of these qualifications and to identify where there are links between Cambridge Nationals and our GCSEs in related subjects.

For example, at the end of April 2014, we're launching a guide that maps content between our Cambridge Nationals in Engineering and GCSEs in Science and Maths and Cambridge Nationals in ICT.



Cambridge Technicals: CHANGE IS ON THE HORIZON...

We're redeveloping our suite of Cambridge Technicals in response to changes being brought in by the Government for Key Stage 5 School and College Performance Tables. The Government's proposing that, to be counted in future School and College Performance Tables, advanced qualifications must be defined in one of three distinct categories (Academic, Applied General and Technical Level) and meet certain characteristics.

WE'RE STAYING EXAM-FREE UNTIL 2016

We're redeveloping the Cambridge Technicals for first teaching in September 2016 to meet all the characteristics, including external assessment. In the meantime, we're extending the existing Cambridge Technicals to allow entries to be made up to the end of August 2016. Learners already on programmes and who have started one- or two-year

programmes in 2013 will carry on with no change to the qualification content or to our assessment model and its administration. A policy of 'wait and see' regarding the changes to Level 3 qualifications, in our opinion, allows time for a proper perspective on the changes to be obtained, so that FE colleges can be appropriately structured to adhere to the modifications when they come into force in two years.
