- 2 give details about the things you like to eat and drink at celebrations (eg sweets / savouries / curries);
- 3 describe a special meal you have helped with or are going to help to make and how you feel about it;
- 4 say if the special meals you eat on special occasions are healthy or unhealthy and why;
- 5 say what changes you would make to the special meals and why.

- 1 talk about where and with whom you spend your free time (eg at home with family / out with friends / alone in my bedroom);
- 2 talk about different activities you do or a club you go to (eg cooking / music and drama / sports);
- 3 talk about a special activity you have done or will do and how you feel about it;
- 4 say whether you think it is important to have hobbies and interests and why;
- 5 say what other activities you would like to be able to do and why.
