Task 1

In this activity learners are required to investigate quality and to answer a series of questions. A link has been provided to the Chartered Institute of Quality (CQI) website – www.thecqi.org

Teachers may find this website useful – particularly the Knowledge Hub section where there are factsheets, case studies and videos.

Teachers might also find it useful to contextualise quality in terms of everyday activities such as manufactured engineering items, and delivery of services (eg maintenance).

Learners have been directed to a fact sheet on 'what is quality' and presented with questions to answer. The activity might be undertaken individually, in pairs or in groups, with feedback in various forms – including a group discussion. Learners should be able to directly identify answers to the questions from the factsheet.

- Who is responsible for quality?
- How can quality be achieved?
