Fig. 1 shows information provided by the environmental agency for pollution incidents in England and Wales.

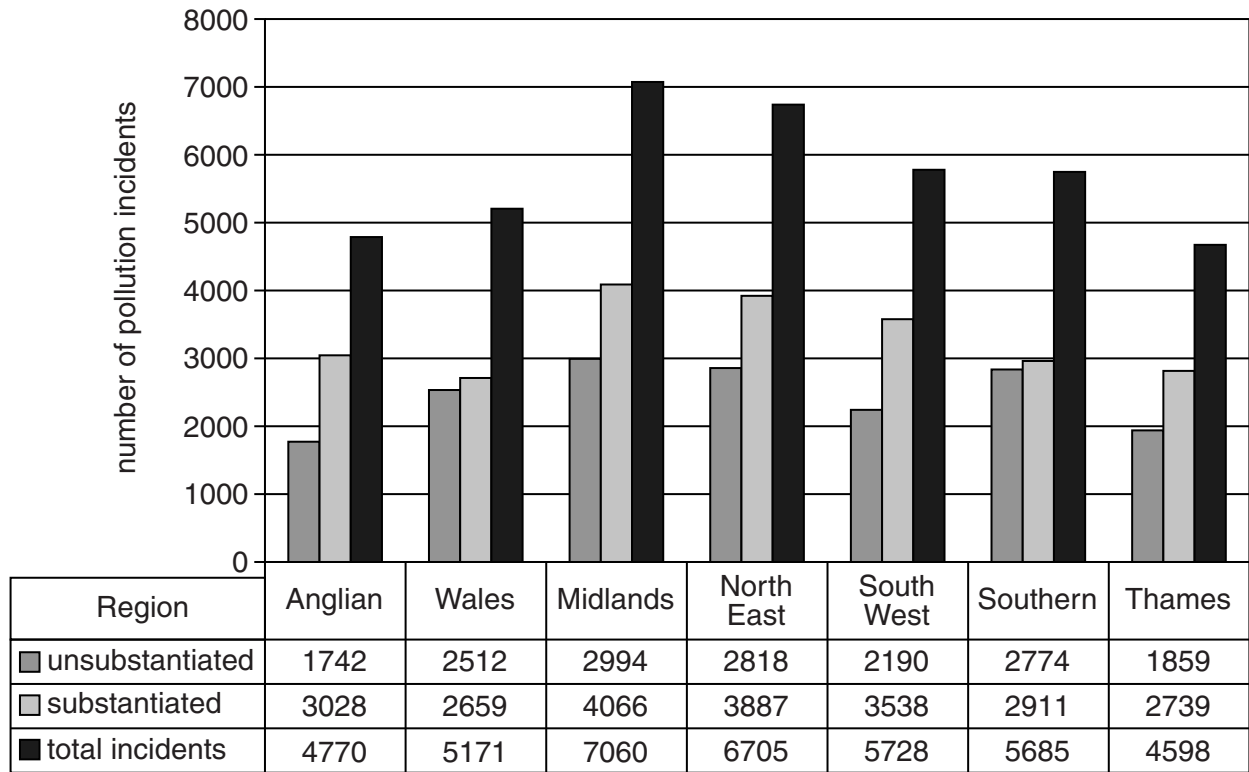
