### Explanatory Notes

#### **GCSE and GCSE Short Course**

The results of GCSE examinations, including those for short courses, are reported on an eight-point grade scale: A\*, A, B, C, D, E, F and G, of which A\* is the highest and G the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade G are shown as Unclassified. Only subjects in which grades A\* to G are attained will be recorded on certificates.

The results of GCSE Double Award examinations are reported on a 15-point grade scale: A\*A\*, A\*A, AA, AB, BB, BC, CC, CD, DD, DE, EE, EF, FF, FG and GG, of which A\*A\* is the highest and GG the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade GG are shown as Unclassified. Only subjects in which grades A\*A\* to GG are attained will be recorded on certificates. Candidates who have achieved sufficient unit results for an award but have not claimed certification may do so retrospectively through their centre, so long as they met the terminal requirement in that series. The centre must submit any late certification requests by 21 September 2017 for the June 2017 series.

#### **GCSE (9-1)**

The results of GCSE (9-1) examinations, including those for Short Courses, are reported on a nine-point grade scale: 9 (nine), 8 (eight), 7 (seven), 6 (six), 5 (five), 4 (four), 3 (three), 2 (two) and 1 (one), of which, 9 (nine) is the highest and 1 (one) the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade 1 (one) receive an unclassified (U) grade, which will not be recorded on the certificate.

The results of GCSE (9-1) English Spoken Language are reported on a three-point scale: Distinction (d), Merit (m) and Pass (p), of which Distinction (d) is the highest and Pass (p) the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required to achieve a Pass (p) receive a Not Classified (nc) grade, which will be recorded on the certificate.

#### **GCSE Units**

The results of GCSE unit examinations are reported on an eight-point grade scale: a\*, a, b, c, d, e, f and g, of which a\* is the highest and g the lowest. In addition, the candidate's uniform mark achieved and the maximum uniform mark available for each unit are reported. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade g are shown as Unclassified.

The results of GCSE English Speaking and Listening and GCSE English Language Speaking and Listening are reported on a five-point scale: 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1, of which 5 is the highest and 1 the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required to achieve a grade 1 receive an unclassified (U) grade, which will not be recorded on the certificate.
