- 1 (a) Explain the religious importance of the Temple to Jews in first-century Palestine. [25]
(b) 'The Temple symbolised all that Jesus criticised about the Judaism of his day.' Discuss. [10]
- 2 (a) Explain how and why Jesus was betrayed and arrested, according to Mark's Passion story. [25]
(b) 'It is unlikely that the betrayal and arrest of Jesus actually happened in the way described by Mark.' Discuss. [10]
- 3 (a) Explain the ways in which Mark presents Jesus' death as a sacrifice and atonement for sin. [25]
(b) 'Mark's account of the crucifixion makes Jesus too human.' Discuss. [10]
- 4 (a) Explain why, in Luke's gospel, the resurrection appearances of Jesus are both a physical and spiritual experience for the disciples. [25]
(b) To what extent is Luke's account of the resurrection appearances convincing? [10]
