The character functions at an effective level making it believable to the viewer. The candidate shows good knowledge of the features that make up a cartoon/animation character, ranging from the concept and development of a character through to placing that character within a story.	The candidate designs a new animation/cartoon character from initial sketches through to finished drawings. They show a level of professionalism in the development process. The progression from initial sketches through character development to final drawings displays a well-rounded character that displays a range of expression and emotion. The candidate has a detailed appreciation of the sum parts of a cartoon or animation character and has described the character's elemental make up in a detailed manner.
