## OCR Nationals ICT – a great success with our students

One of the most striking things about the Nationals qualification is the range of students and ability levels it caters for. Courses attract the full range of students, both on the compulsory Level 2 as well as on the optional Level 3 course offered in the Sixth Form. The continuous assessment approach is favoured by students over modular exams – they enjoy the hands-on approach, and being involved with the assessment. It allows all students to show their full potential, not just those who excel in exams.

### Achievement

For Brooke Weston, the success of ICT Nationals has been huge. 100% pass rates are achieved with the Level 2 compulsory course. The success of Level 2 ICT, and the course format of Nationals in general, has led to stronger links with OCR and increased results success.

### Career progression

The relevance of Nationals to the work environment is backed up by a programme of weekly work placements in industry and at sister schools. The success of the Nationals’ unit-based approach has allowed many students to progress to University for further study.

## Qualification Overview

### ICT Nationals aims to:

- Develop learners’ skills, knowledge and understanding – with special relevance to jobs in ICT
- Enable progression to further education programmes or occupational training, enter employment or enhance their current employment status
- Develop a learner’s ability to work autonomously and effectively
- Enable learners to develop knowledge and understanding in specialist areas of ICT
- Promote interaction between employers, centres and learners.

### Features:

- Centre-assessed and externally moderated by OCR
- No timetabled exams – candidates complete units at a time that suits the centre
- Grades are Pass, Merit or Distinction
- Levels 1, 2 and 3 – eligible for funding under the Learning and Skills Council.
