

# SCRABBLE

## THE GAME



Did you know? Scrabble is a very popular board game all over the world. It is sold in 121 different countries in 29 languages.

## HISTORY

The idea began in 1931 in America, but the game only became really well known twenty years later. There are even World Championships nowadays!



## HOW TO PLAY

This is a game for 2–4 players: children or adults.  
 Each person chooses seven letters (without looking!).  
 On the letters there are points, for example A = 1, Z = 10.  
 Players try to make up the best word they can with their letters, which they place on a board.  
 The next player then has a turn and so on until there are no letters left.

## HOW TO WIN

At the end of the game the board looks like a crossword puzzle! Where you position your letters is important: whoever gets the most points wins!

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
