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1 Overview:

Government policy on getting people into work is still a positive factor in terms of these qualifications. With its emphasis on individual research based on setting up a specific business and the completion of a business plan capable of being presented to funding organisations this qualification meets this requirement.

The government continues to emphasise the importance of educating prisoners to prepare them for the world of work which would dovetail very well with this qualification.

The numbers doing this qualification has declined due to funding issues, but there has been some upswing in numbers towards the end of the year.

It has been good to see that centres have nearly always correctly identified the right Level at which to enter their candidates with some then progressing from Level 2 to Level 3.

2 General Comments

10313 Level 2 is the more popular of the two units as it can be completed in a shorter period of time. It provides a basic introduction in aspects of setting up and running one's own business. The standard of work produced has normally been good.

10314 Level 3 There has been some excellent work seen by the external verifiers this year. Most of this work has shown that the candidates are well prepared to go out into the world of work and to run their own business.

In both Levels it is important that centres index, flag or by some other means indicate where the various assessment criteria are being met. In addition, careful attention must be paid to the different command words associated with the assessment criteria.

3 Comments on Individual Units

Unit 2 – it is important to note that both ACs 1.2 and 2.2 say 'assess' and not explain. Explain is clearly an aspect of assess, but it does not fulfil the evaluate element.

Units 4 and 13 For these units it is important that a full range of legislation and legal requirements are considered. An entrepreneur needs to be aware of what has to be complied with.

Units 18 and 19 one or other of these should be offered at Level 3 as these candidates have the opportunity of testing their plans before going into the real world. There has been some excellent work seen with both units and it is good that centres have been using external business people to offer comments.
