

- to give factual information and explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others).
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- say where you live and what you like about it;
- say how you normally go to school (eg walk / bus / car);
- give details of a day you have spent, or plan to spend, showing someone around your local area and say how you feel about it;
- say whether or not you think that your local area is an interesting place to explore and why;
- say what should be done to encourage families to use local public transport more and explain why.

Write a blog-post about the benefits of sport.

Remember:

- to give factual information and explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others).
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- say what sports you do and who you do them with;
- give details of your favourite sport and where you do it (eg swimming/at school/athletics/at a club);
- · describe a sports event that you have watched, or plan to watch, and say how you feel about it;
- say whether or not you think that famous sports stars are good role models for young people and why;
- say what you would do to encourage your friends to spend more time doing sports and why.

Question 3 Leisure and entertainment

Write an email to your Portuguese friend about special occasions.

Remember:

- to give factual information and explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others).
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- say what you usually do at the weekend and who with;
- say which special occasions you like (eg birthday parties / weddings / festivals);
- · describe your last birthday party, or your plans for the next one, and say how you feel about it;
- say whether or not you think that special occasions are good for families and friends and why;
- if you could plan a surprise party for a friend, say what you would do to make it very special and why.

Question 4 Travel and the wider world

Write a letter to your Brazilian friend about your holidays.

Remember:

- to give factual information and explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others).
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- say where you usually go on holiday and who with;
- give details of what you do on holiday (eg swim / relax / take photos);
- · describe a holiday you have recently had, or plan to have soon, and how you feel about it;
- say whether or not you think that holidays can be boring, and why;
- say where you would go and what you would do on a special holiday with your friends, and why.

Question 5 Education and work

Write a web article about your future job.

Remember:

- to give factual information and explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others).
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- say which school subjects you like;
- give details of a job you are interested in (eg teacher / engineer / electrician / hairdresser);
- describe what you have done, or plan to do, to find out more about the job and say how you feel about it;
- say whether or not you think it is important to have a job you like and why;
- if you could choose to work anywhere in the world, say where you would go, what job you would do, and why.
