The price of domestic energy is forever increasing. So it makes sense to economise.

A typical household can save around £30 a year just by turning off electrical appliances whenever possible. However, some satellite and digital TV recorders may need to be left on, so check the instruction book first!

Be careful in the kitchen and save up to £45 a year.



Set your washing machine to wash at 30 degrees.

Use appliances at night if you have Economy 7 electricity.

Don't leave the hot tap running while washing up.

Only boil the amount of water you need to make tea or coffee.



Use the shower – don't fill a bath.

Keep the cold out. Install new heating controls to keep the temperature you prefer.

Switch to another supplier if it offers a lower tariff.




