Item Name	Comment
3aii	Second point re wages is valid and well developed in terms of remittances, worth 3 marks (L2). First point "employment opportunities" worth one mark as a undeveloped factor.
4A01	This essay was largely generalised and descriptive comments about the role of the UN and the Indian Government. A02 in level 1 basic, unsupported judgements.
1c	First point relates to ability to purchase food plus links to diet and health. Second point refers to education, university fees and future prospects.
3ai	Two advantages clearly stated with appropriate development of each.
1d A01	Largely descriptive relating to Saddleworth Moor and demographic statistics, some evaluation which links to that evidence but is more limited.
1b	First player clear-local government plus some development. Second player generalised as "private player" but does link to the Karting business with some development.
1a	Relevant piece of evidence, plus just one point of development.
3b	Two valid points with development (language barrier-strain on services/water) (L3). Development of the language point not totally convincing, hence 7 not 8 marks.
