Your guide to the changes for 2021

Following an [Ofqual consultation](#), we have made changes to a number of our qualifications.

The changes are designed to reduce the pressure on teachers and students in the 2020/21 academic year, and to safeguard against ongoing public health concerns.

Overview of changes for GCSE (9–1) Science

Ofqual have confirmed that students taking GCSE Science in summer 2021 are allowed to watch demonstrations and/or simulations to cover the required apparatus and techniques if they are unable to carry out practical science activities.

- There is still a requirement for students to learn the skills and techniques related to practical activities (at least 8 activities for each of Biology, Chemistry and Physics, at least 16 activities for Combined Science).
- If students are unable to carry out practical science activities, they are able to watch a teacher demonstration or a video, or use a simulation.
- All assessments remain the same.
- A minimum of 15% of the marks on the assessment will still test the apparatus and techniques covered by the practical activity groups (PAGs).
- A 2021 version of the NEA Centre Declaration form will still need to be signed and submitted.
