# Your guide to the changes for 2021

Following an Ofgual consultation, we have made changes to a number of our qualifications.

The changes are designed to reduce the pressure on teachers and students in the 2020/21 academic year, and to safeguard against ongoing public health concerns.

Please <u>use the specification on our website</u> alongside this document which shows how our qualifications will differ in summer 2021.

### **Overview of changes for GCSE Geography A**

Ofqual have confirmed that students taking Geography in summer 2021:

- will **not** be asked questions during the exams in relation to their own fieldwork experience.
- will still be asked questions during the exams on unfamiliar fieldwork contexts.
- Centres do not need to sign a Fieldwork Statement confirming that fieldwork has taken place on at least two occasions.

We will be producing updated Sample Assessment Material to show how the assessment will look in 2021.

To prepare students for the unfamiliar fieldwork questions, teachers should provide students with the opportunity to engage in the enquiry process and fieldwork where possible, whether that is 'in the field' or through virtual fieldwork (classroom based). 'In the field' could include the school grounds and local area (to the school or student's home). Further information and support can be found on the <a href="OCR website">OCR website</a>.

### GCSE Geography A for academic year 2020/21

Students must complete all three assessments to be awarded a GCSE in geography in **summer 2021**. There has been **no** change to the specification content. Themes 1.1 – 2.3 (<u>specification pages 6-12</u>) and the geographical skills (<u>specification pages 13-14</u>) will need to be taught.

There will be no changes to Components 01 and 02.

The changes to Component 03 are only in relation to fieldwork for section B. The table above indicates any changes and these are explained below:

- The qualification total has changed from 200 to 185 marks.
- The component weightings have changed, Components 01 and 02 from 30% to 32.4% and Component 03 from 40% to 35.2%.

The following information refers to Component 03 only

- We will remove questions which relate to the student's own fieldwork experience, this equates to 15 marks.
- There will still be questions related to unfamiliar fieldwork contexts (section B) and these will equate to 15 marks. The
  questions will be in the same style as those shown in the Sample Assessment Materials, Practice Papers, and the past
  papers from 2018 and 2019.
- The unfamiliar fieldwork questions will include **both** physical and human geography fieldwork contexts. The questions will relate to these two fieldwork contexts:

The physical fieldwork context is **coasts**.

The human fieldwork context is urban.

- The exam paper has been reduced from 80 marks to 65 marks to reflect the removal of the own fieldwork questions.
- The duration of the exam paper has changed from 1 hour and 30 minutes to 1 hour and 20 minutes (as own fieldwork questions have been removed).
- In section B, there will be 7 marks for lower tariff questions and one higher tariff question (8 marks) with a further 3 marks for SPAG.

Within the assessments, 6% of the marks will be assessing AO3 applied in fieldwork context(s) and 3% of the marks will be associated with AO4 applied to responding to questions with fieldwork data and contexts.
