

Post-16 Level 3 qualifications reform – quick reference guide

UPDATED following the
General Election July 2024

The post-16 landscape (subject to review)

Since the General Election in July 2024, the new Labour government have indicated that they would pause the defunding of any qualifications that were due to be defunded in 2024 by 12 months, in order to give them enough time to review Level 3. This DfE “rapid review” will report at the end of 2024 and will give a clear indication of all the qualifications that will be funded from September 2025.

This means that centres have been able to teach the OCR Level 3 Diploma in IT (720 GLH) and OCR Level 3 Extended Diploma in IT (1080 GLH) from September 2024, alongside all the other Cambridge Technical qualifications.

We have already confirmed that our new Cycle 1 Cambridge Advanced Nationals (AAQ) will be available.

This DfE “rapid review” will also form part of the wider DfE Review of the Curriculum and Assessment, led by Professor Becky Francis.

Summary

As a result of the reform, there could be two routes available for students. They could choose between:

- A Levels or a mixed curriculum of, typically, two A Levels alongside a vocational qualification, known as an Alternative Academic Qualification
- T Levels or they may wish to enrol in an apprenticeship.

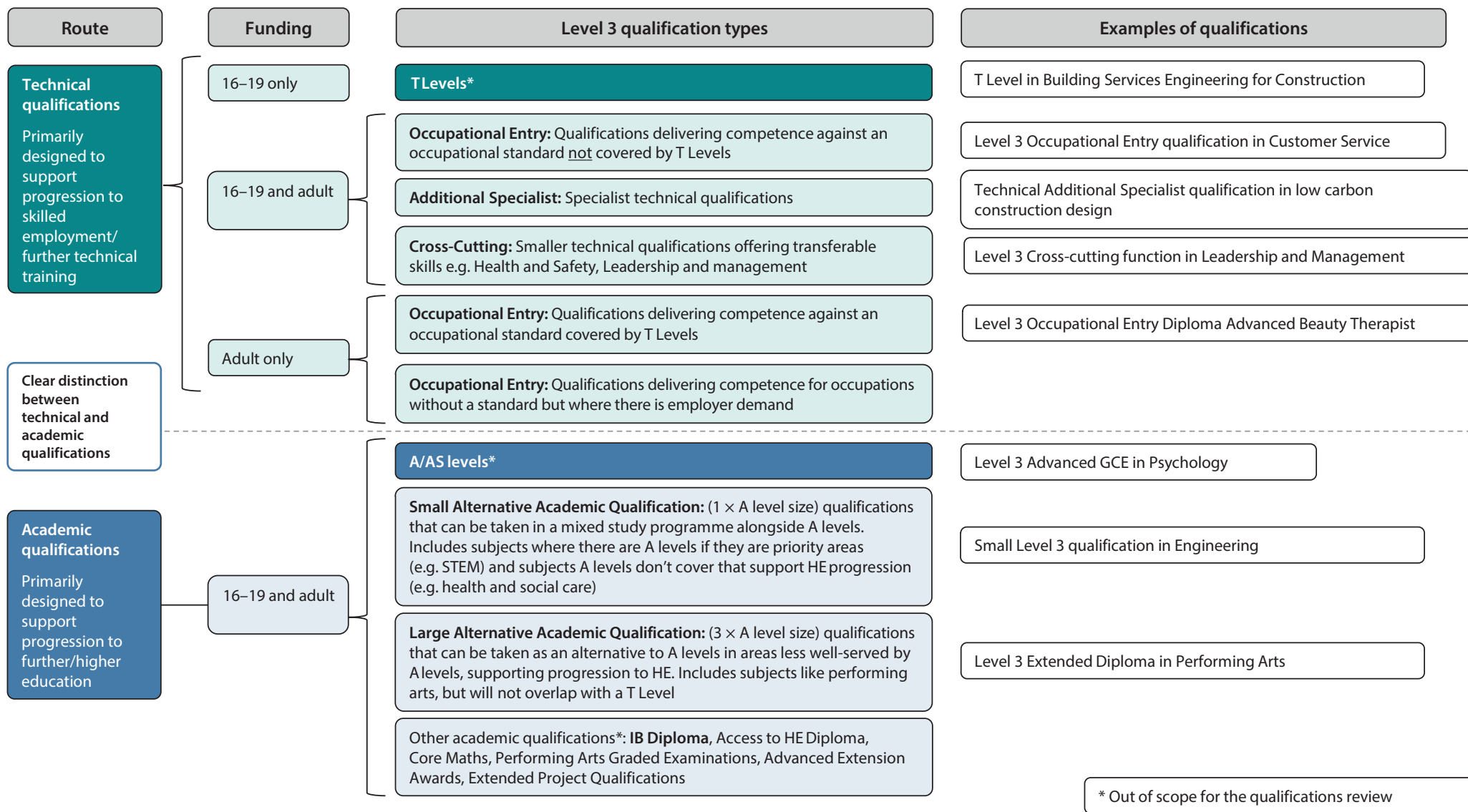
Alternative Academic Qualifications will be developed in two cycles:

- Cycle 1 will include subjects that align with waves 1 and 2 of T Level roll-out with qualifications being funded from September 2025.
- Cycle 2 will include everything not covered in Cycle 1. The DfE have not yet announced a submission date for cycle 2 AAQs.

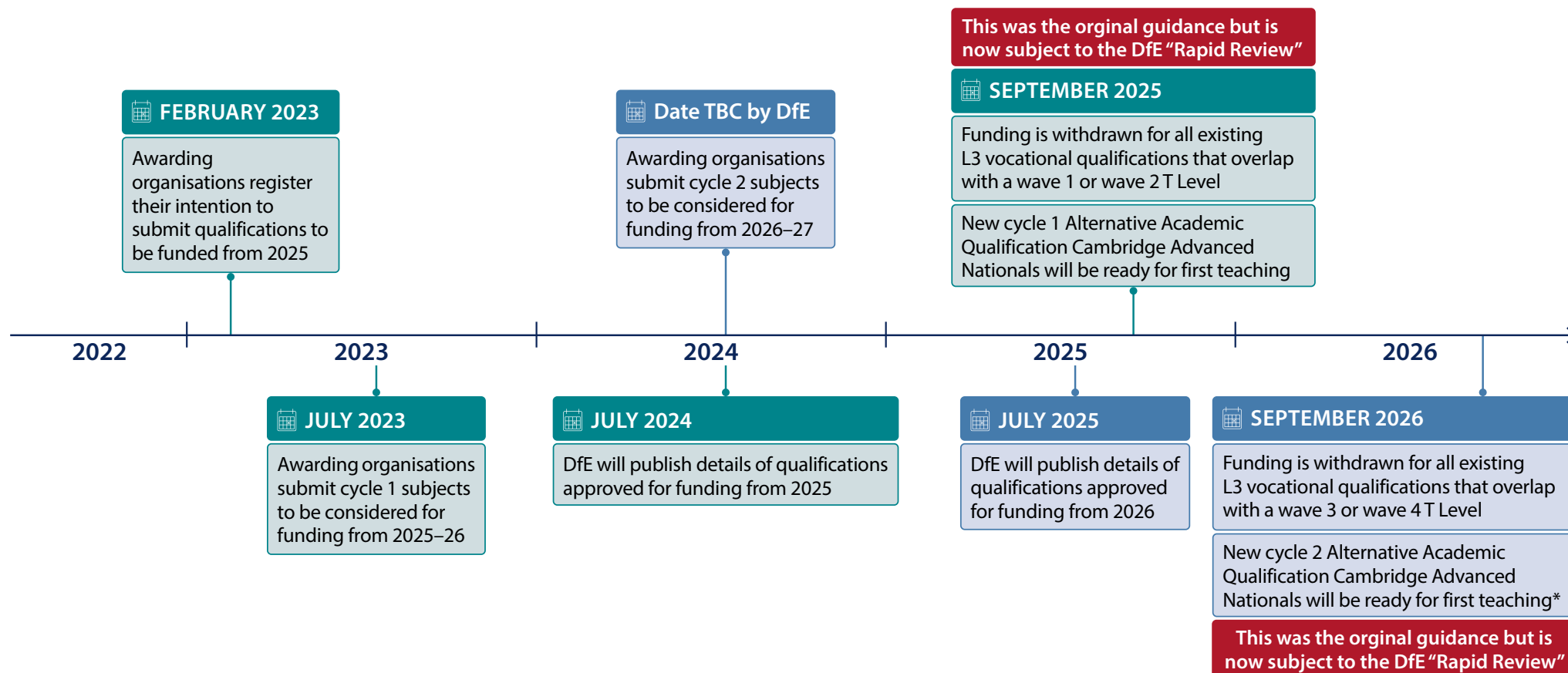

Where are we now?

The Post-16 reform of qualifications at Level 3 will have an impact on the qualifications you teach from September 2025.

As it stands, our Alternative Academic Qualifications (AAQs) have been approved for first teach in September 2025 and funding for our current Cambridge Technicals is extended for the September 2024 new starters. The DfE curriculum review, due at the end of 2024 will finalise which qualifications are funded from September 2025.

The new Alternative Academic Qualifications will not have the range of subjects or sizes that the Cambridge Technicals had. This has been decided by the DfE.

- There will be small, 1 A level sized qualifications allowed.
- They are deemed small as they will range from 150–420 Guided Learning Hours (GLH). An A level is 360 GLH.
- The first cycle (Cycle 1) of subjects were submitted to the DfE in 2023 and have been approved for first teach in September 2025.
- DfE have not yet announced a submission date for Cycle 2 AAQs.
- Funding for current Cambridge Technicals was extended for the September 2024 new starters. The DfE curriculum review, due at the end of 2024 will finalise which qualifications are funded from September 2025.
- There will be no large sizes of Alternative Academic Qualifications (720 GLH or 1080 GLH) apart from subjects where there are no T Levels (e.g. Sport and Performing Arts).
- The subjects where there will be Alternative Academic Qualifications have been determined by the DfE and is detailed in the guidance. If we propose any new subjects not currently offered as Cambridge Technicals, we will have to notify the DfE in February 2024.
- There will be no “Business” Alternative Academic Qualification. DfE Ministers have deemed that this subject is already well served by both an A level and a T Level and that offer will suffice.
- The DfE have indicated that only 1 Alternative Academic Qualification (typically alongside 2 A Levels) will be permitted, unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- No learner will be able to study 3 Alternative Academic Qualifications as their study programme.



What does this mean for Cambridge Technicals?

We've developed Cambridge Advanced Nationals, a suite of Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualifications designed to meet the DfE's criteria for Alternative Academic Qualifications and complement existing A Levels in post-16 programmes of study.

Cambridge Advanced Nationals will provide students with the practical and essential skills and knowledge they need to better prepare themselves for entry into higher education and university.

All our cycle 1 Level 3 150 GLH, 180 GLH (AS Level size) and 360 GLH (A Level size) Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced Nationals have been approved for inclusion on key stage 5 performance tables in England from 1 August 2025.

The following qualification are available for first teaching in September 2025.

- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Applied Science
- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Human Biology
- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Computing: Application Development
- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in IT: Data Analytics
- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Engineering
- Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Health and Social Care

We will be redeveloping further qualifications for the second cycle for first teach in 2026. These include (subject to DfE approval):

- Creative Media Production
- Sport, Exercise and Health
- Enterprise and Innovation
- Policing and Criminal Justice*
- Mental Health and Wellbeing
- Sustainability
- Cyber Security and Digital Networking
- Marketing
