Scrapstore

Extract A – What is Scrapstore?

Scrapstore is a registered charity based in a former school. It collects unwanted items such as cardboard, glass jars, ribbons, buttons, pieces of fabric and unused tins of paint. It then sells these items to the general public for a small fee - £5 per basket or £10 per trolley. Many of the items sold are donated by local companies and include some that would otherwise be sent to local landfill sites.

The general public can visit the charity to see what items it has available; these items can vary from day to day and week to week, depending on what has been donated. The items are then used in the home, nurseries and schools to create gifts, decorations or artwork.

Scrapstore employs five part-time staff and a full-time manager. It also has eight unpaid volunteers, who offer their time for free each week.

In addition to collecting and selling unwanted items, Scrapstore hosts Art and Craft Workshops, where children and their parents are encouraged to come along and be creative together. The employees and volunteers at Scrapstore aim to make the workshops a fun way to reuse waste materials, as well as encouraging people to learn more about sustainability.

Promotion for Scrapstore takes place via Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, as well as its own website. These all list any upcoming events and workshops, plus useful information such as opening times, a location map and contact details.

10 103 adults in Great Britain were surveyed in May 2018, to understand the ways that people are involved in volunteering. Some of the results are listed below.

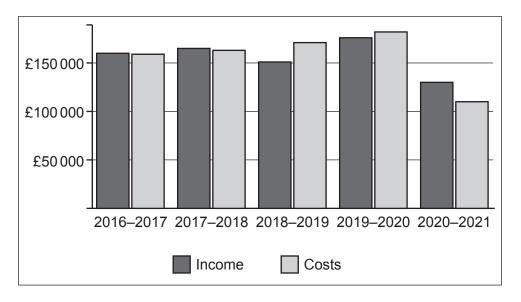
| Have you volunteered? | Percentage of people surveyed (%) |
