The Triangle Harriers

Mia is the Membership and Web Officer for The Triangle Harriers Running Club. The Triangle Harriers has approximately 400 members.

Membership

Members complete an online form when joining the running club. The online form includes:

- name, address and preferred contact number
- · credit card or bank account details
- email address
- health information
- previous running experience.

The information from the online form is stored on a USB drive plugged into the back of Mia's router. The email address is used to send out a weekly newsletter that is edited by Mia.

Web

Mia has set up an old laptop to function as a webserver. The laptop is plugged directly into the router and is managed from an app on Mia's mobile phone.

The website for The Triangle Harriers is stored on the laptop.

As Web Officer, Mia is responsible for updating the contents of the website. The software on the laptop has not been updated for some time.

- Different types of attacker and their motivations including why the attacker would choose to target Mia and The Triangle Harriers Running Club.
