

- (a) ὁ μὲν Νικίας ... ἀσφαλῶς ἐκπλεῦσαι (lines 1–3): what does Thucydides claim Nicias thought might happen as a result of his speech? [3]
- **(b)*** οἱ δὲ τὸ μὲν ἐπιθυμοῦν ... ἡσυχίαν ἦγεν (lines 3–13): how does Thucydides emphasise that Nicias' speech had the opposite effect to the one he wanted?

You should refer to **both** the content **and** to the language of the passage.



(d) Translate καὶ όπότε ... εἰς τὸ πρόσθεν (lines 17–20).


