





Hairdressing salons in Kirk Ella

Kirk Ella is a large, wealthy village in Yorkshire. Three hairdressing salons are located very close to each other in the centre of the village (see **Fig. 1**). These salons are called Robyn & Rozy, Mark Hill Hair Cosmetics Ltd. and No.4 Packman Lane.

Extract A Robyn & Rozy

Robyn and Rozy were friends for more than 20 years before becoming partners in their own hairdressing salon in 2019 which is called Robyn & Rozy. Before this they both worked at Mark Hill Hair Cosmetics Ltd. (see **Extract C**) where their roles included styling celebrities for photoshoots and events such as Red Nose Day, the Brit Awards and London Fashion week.

Their salon specialises in colouring and styling hair, although they offer a wide range of other services, such as cuts and hair extensions.

The salon is a small and friendly place. Customers are treated to a good selection of free drinks and snacks whilst in the salon, including tea, coffee, soft drinks, and biscuits. Appointments can be made either by phone or the salon's own website.

Advertising is done via their own website, Facebook, and Instagram. Photos are taken of clients, with their permission, to be included on the salon's Facebook page. Customer recommendations are included on the website and many customers have left excellent reviews on Facebook.

Extract C Mark Hill Hair Cosmetics Ltd.

Situated close to Robyn & Rozy is another hairdressing salon, a private limited company called Mark Hill Hair Cosmetics Ltd. Mark Hill is a well-known entrepreneur and hairdresser with many celebrity customers. He has been hairdressing for over 40 years and has won numerous hairdressing awards. He has his own range of branded hair products which can be bought in stores and online.

Mark works three days a week in his salon, dedicating the rest of his time to his celebrity customers and promoting his brand. He has a team of hairdressers who work in the salon on a day-to-day basis.

Customers telephone to make an appointment. The salon has a website which is used to introduce the hairdressers, show their price lists and enable people to buy from the 'Mark Hill' range of branded products. The salon has a Facebook page where customers can leave reviews. This also includes photos of celebrity events where Mark and his team have styled hair.

Mark Hill's salon location is hidden away, situated on a narrow lane with only a small sign next to the door and 'MHS' branding on the front gate.

Near Robyn & Rozy is a third hairdressing salon, No.4 Packman Lane. This salon is owned by Liz, who operates as a sole trader.

Liz opened the salon in 2015. Initially she worked alone, but she now employs another hairdresser. In addition, a beauty therapist and a natural health therapist pay Liz rent to use space within the salon.

The salon specialises in colouring hair, cuts and blow dries. Appointments can be made by telephoning the salon. Promotion is done via Facebook and Instagram. Many satisfied customers have left reviews on the salon's Facebook page.
