The front pages refer to the England women's national football team winning the 2022 UEFA European Women's Championship. The team's nickname is the Lionesses. It was the first time an England national football team had won a major international trophy since 1966 so was widely celebrated.

Source B also refers to Liz Truss and Penny Mordaunt who were both in the contest to become the next leader of the Conservative party (and also Prime Minister) after Boris Johnson resigned.

The front cover features Michael Palin, an actor, comedian and writer. He became famous in the 1960s as part of the comedy group 'Monty Python's Flying Circus'. Palin has since made a number of travel documentaries, the first of which was called *Around The World In 80 Days*. The documentary was based on a book of the same name written in 1870 about a fictional character named Phileas Fogg, who tried to travel around the world in 80 days.

The cover also refers to Citroën, the French motor vehicle manufacturer. They announced a three-year partnership with *The Big Issue* in August 2022, which included providing *The Big Issue* with a fleet of electric delivery vans.
