Option A – Coastal Landscapes

- (a) Study **Fig. 1** which shows a coastal landscape in Wales.
- (i) Using evidence from **Fig. 1**, identify **three** inputs to the coastal landscape system. [3]
- (ii) Suggest **one** way that waves might influence this coastal landscape system. [4]
- (b) Explain the formation of salt marshes. [8]
- (c)* 'Only physical factors influence the formation of landforms within the coastal landscape system.' Discuss in the context of **one** high energy coastline. [14]

OR

Option B – Glaciated Landscapes

- (a) Study **Fig. 2** which shows a glacial landscape in Canada.
- (i) Using evidence from **Fig. 2**, identify **three** inputs to the glacial landscape system. [3]
- (ii) Suggest **one** way that climate might influence this glacial landscape system. [4]
- (b) Explain the formation of till sheets. [8]
- (c)* 'Only physical factors influence the formation of landforms within the glaciated landscape system.' Discuss in the context of **one** landscape associated with the action of valley glaciers. [14]

OR

Option C – Dryland Landscapes

- (a) Study **Fig. 3** which shows a dryland landscape in Jordan.
- (i) Using evidence from **Fig. 3**, identify **three** inputs to the dryland landscape system. [3]
- (ii) Suggest **one** way that climate might influence this dryland landscape system. [4]
- (b) Explain the formation of linear dunes. [8]
- (c)* 'Only physical factors influence the formation of landforms within the dryland landscape system.' Discuss in the context of **one** mid-latitude desert. [14]

Section B – Changing Spaces; Making Places

- (a) Explain **two** different ways of measuring social inequality. [4]
- (b) Study **Fig. 4A**, which shows government health spending per person for selected countries, 2021.
- (i) Using evidence from **Fig. 4A**, identify **one** contrast in government health spending between Europe and sub-Saharan Africa. [1]
- (ii) With reference to **Fig. 4A**, suggest **two** possible reasons for variation in government health spending. [4]
- (c) Study **Fig. 4B**, which shows a 1:25 000 OS map extract of Irlam, City of Salford, Greater Manchester.
- Using evidence from **Fig. 4B**, explain how flows of money and investment might have helped to shape the place profile of Irlam. [6]
- (d)* ‘Making a successful place through rebranding requires more than one type of strategy.’ Discuss. [14]

Section C – Fieldwork

- (a) Study **Fig. 4B**, which shows a 1:25 000 OS map extract of Irlam, City of Salford, Greater Manchester where a geographical investigation is to be undertaken.
- (i) Using evidence from **Fig. 4B**, state and justify an appropriate field research question for investigation in the area shown. [4]
- (ii) Outline **two** difficulties you might encounter in collecting data for your chosen investigation. [2]
- (b) Suggest **two** possible advantages of using crowd-sourced data to generate geographical information. [6]
- (c) With reference to a fieldwork investigation you have carried out, evaluate the techniques you used to analyse the data collected. [12]
