Global distribution of hot deserts

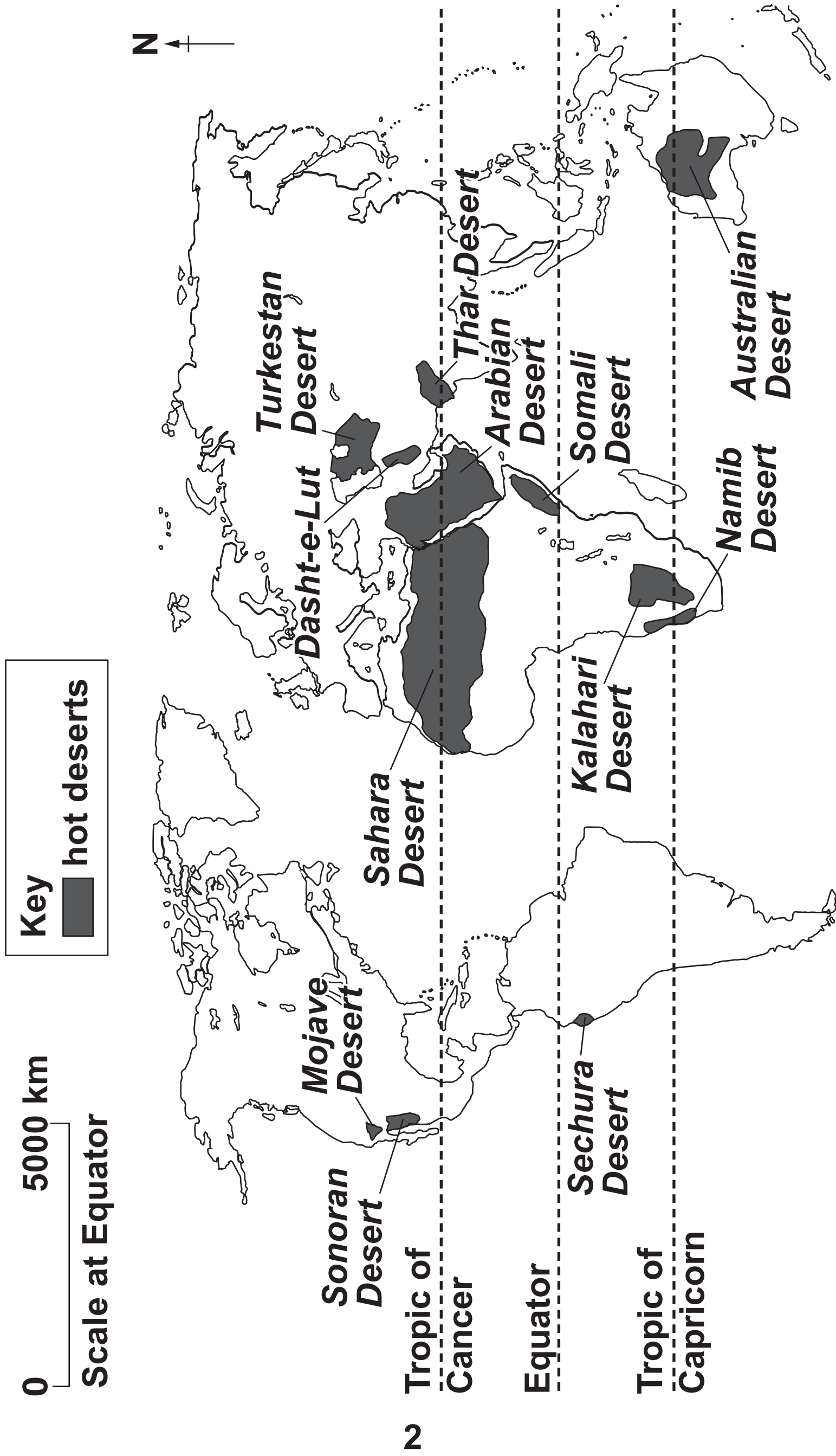

A coral reef ecosystem

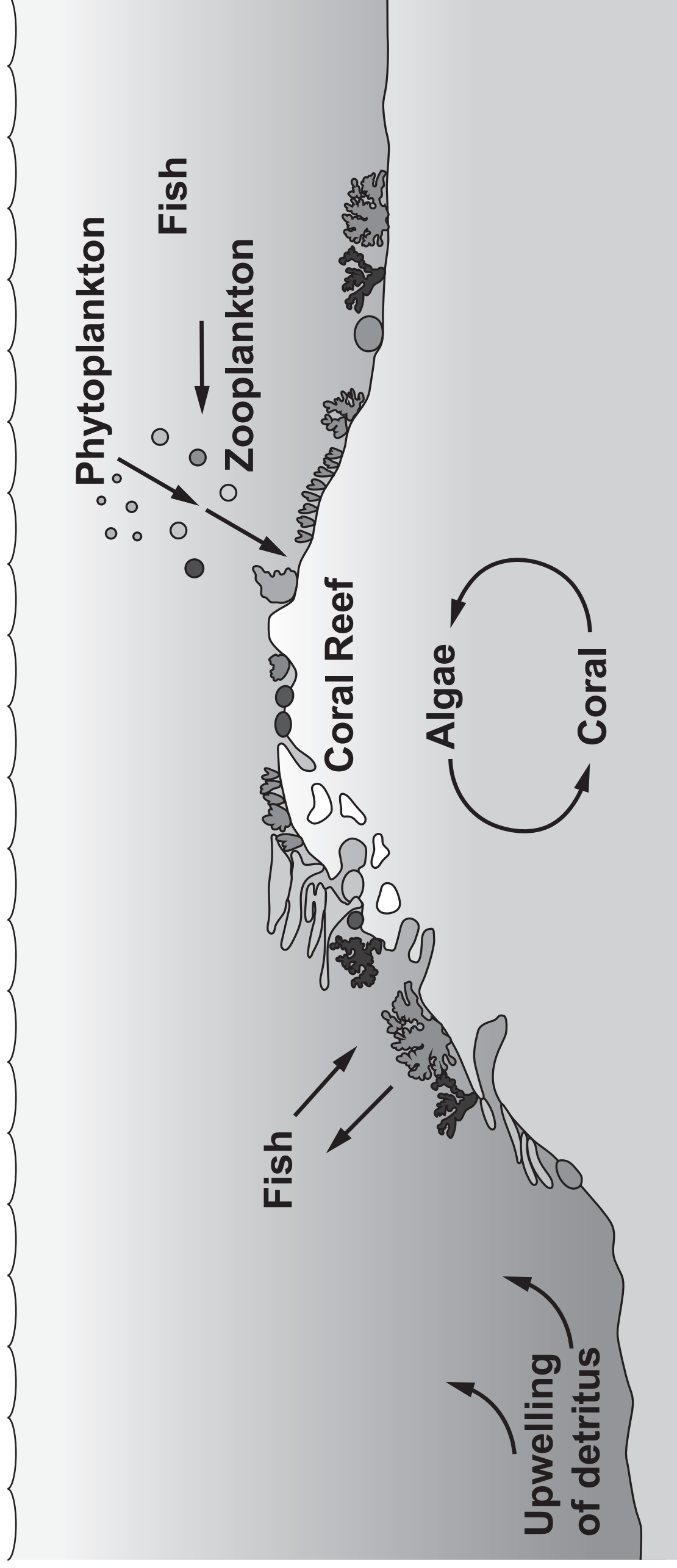

Changes in percentage of population living in urban areas in different continents of the world

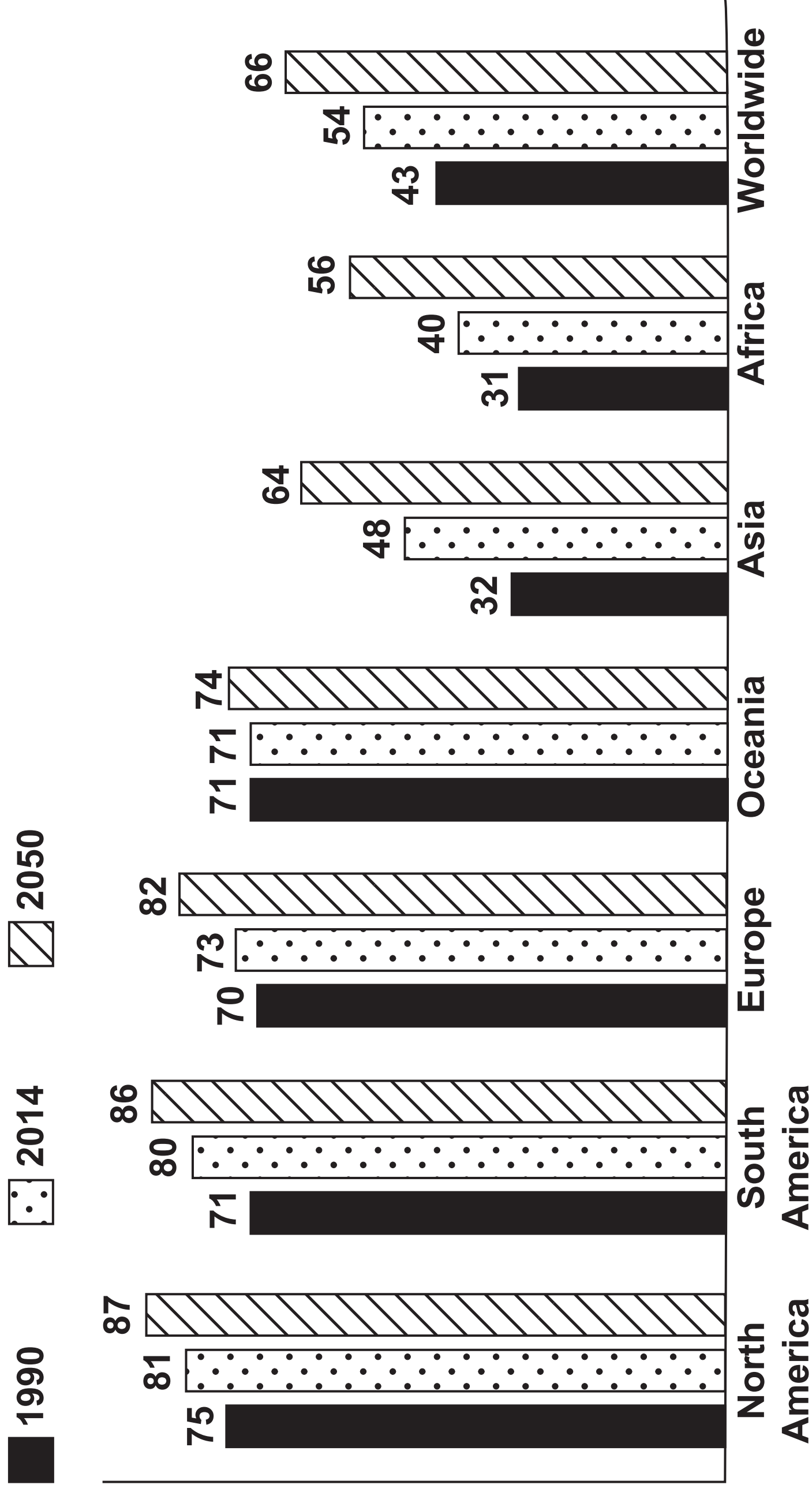

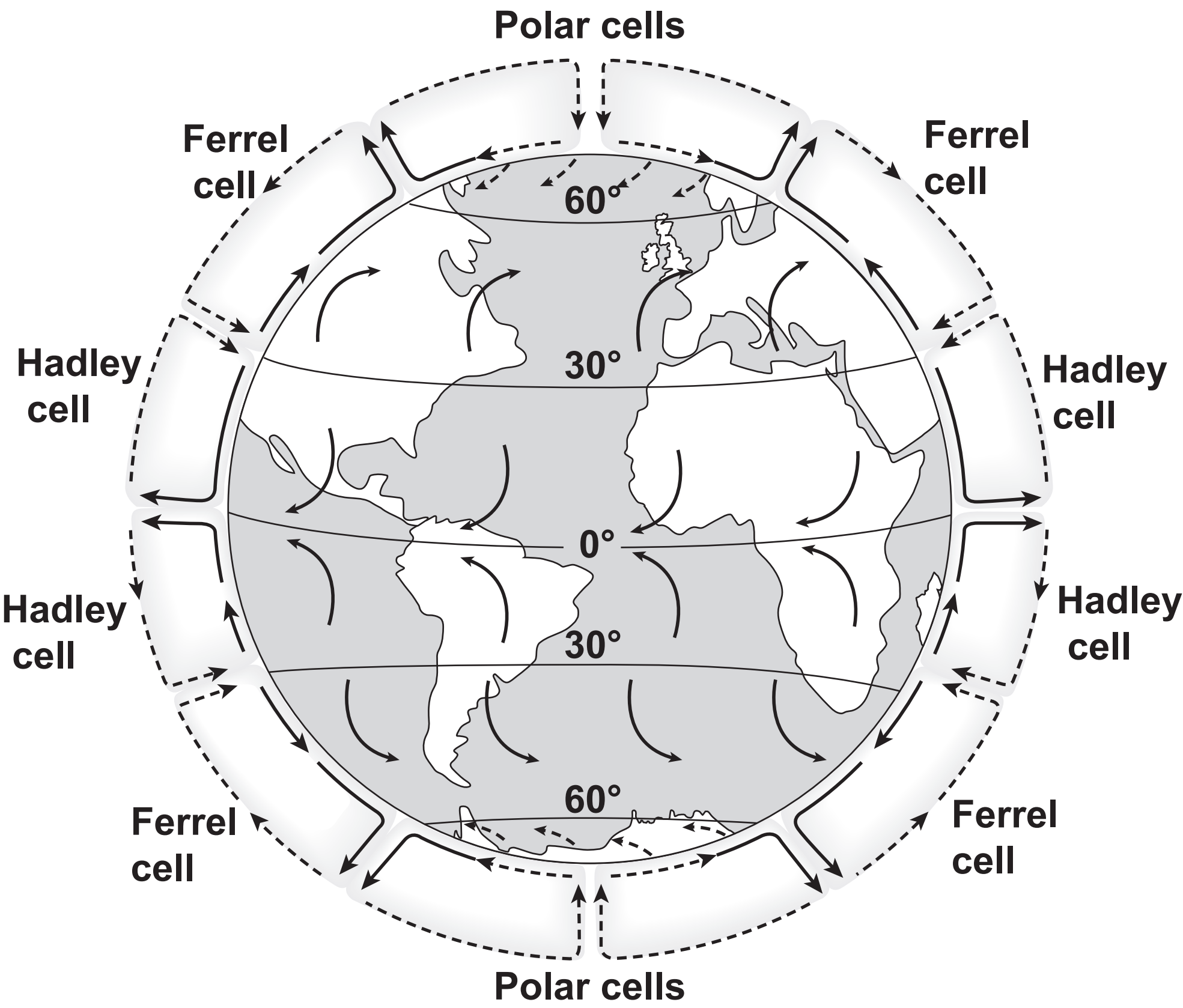
