- You should consider how you revise other parts of the specification, for example to review whether other topics may provide knowledge which helps your understanding in relation to the areas being tested in 2022.

Section A:

Section B:

The main sociological explanations of social inequality and difference:

- Marxism

Section B:

Option 1: Crime and Deviance

The social distribution of offending and victimisation:

- social class
- gender
- ethnicity

Consider the explanations of crime and the patterns and trends of offending in relation to social class, gender and ethnicity.

Option 2: Education

Explanations for differential educational achievement:

- inside and outside school factors
- structural, material and cultural factors

The question may relate to social class, gender or ethnicity

Option 3: Religion, belief and faith

Theoretical views of the role of religion, belief and faith for the individual and for society:

- Weberianism
- feminism
- phenomenology
- postmodernism
